The Hūnua Traverse

The Hūnua Traverse which is classified as a Grade 4 Cycle Trail, suited to intermediate and advanced cyclists opened in full on Friday 1 December, providing a 44.5km two-way link between Auckland (Clevedon) and Waikato (Kaiaua) via the stunning Hūnua Ranges Regional Park.

Following last summer's gnarly weather, the central connector on this Ngā Haerenga Heartland Ride was closed due to road instability, meaning the Hūnua Traverse has – until now – only been opened as two unconnected segments.



Cyclists should expect steep, slippery hills and some sharp off-camber corners. The route can be ridden in both directions on shared roads.

Cyclists should expect vehicles, including trucks and machinery at times, and pedestrian traffic as well as other cyclists. The route follows public roads as well as unsealed Watercare service roads within the Hūnua Ranges Regional Park. At the northern end, riders should note that car parking is available in Clevedon village and at the top of Moumoukai Hill Road but there is strictly no car parking at the top of Otau Mountain Road as parked cars block the turning circle required for service and emergency vehicles.

Temporary closures of the Hūnua Traverse may be required at times to accommodate forestry operations, pest control, maintenance or on occasion to mitigate fire risk during the fire season.

Riders should check the Hūnua Traverse website for up-to-date access information.

The Hūnua Traverse has been funded by the Franklin Local Board and is delivered in partnership with Watercare, Auckland Regional Parks and Ngā Haerenga NZCT.

Saturday November 5th 2023

There was no one staying in the hut the night we were there but it was spotlessly clean. What goes up must come down and the following morning we had the pleasure of a downhill run all the way back to the car.
